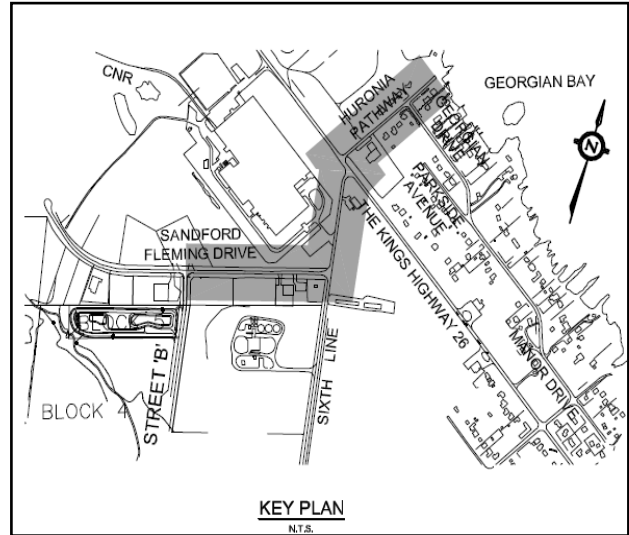

Collingwood Industrial Area Sanitary and Watermain Servicing Project

Client: Town of Collingwood

Location: Town of Collingwood, Ontario

The Town of Collingwood is undertaking a program of extending and upgrading existing sanitary sewer and watermain services to the South Collingwood Industrial Area. Greenland Consulting Engineers prepared a servicing options study brief for the area and was retained by the Town of Collingwood to prepare the final design for the area and oversee the project through the Construction Phase. The project included the extension of the trunk sanitary sewer from its current location on Huronia Pathway, south across Highway 26, along Sixth Line and west down Sanford Fleming Drive. The project also included the installation of process watermain along Highway 26, down Sixth Line, and onto Sanford Fleming Drive, and the construction of the new Ron Emo Road sanitary sewer, domestic watermain and road right of way between Sanford Fleming Drive and Raglan Street.



The project also included restoration and improvements to the associated industrial roadways for the Town (namely Sandford Fleming Drive, Sixth Line and Huronia Pathway); the new construction of Ron Emo Road between the existing Sandford Fleming Drive and Raglan Street; the reconnection of existing services; and the installation of new services to lots where servicing is not currently available. The replacement or provision of servicing is proposed to accommodate new industrial development south of Sanford Fleming Drive.



Greenland worked closely with Town staff to implement the project in a well-planned, efficient, and cost effective manner. Construction of the project was completed in the spring of 2010 at a cost of \$2.5 million.
